Richard Gowers begins his third visit to the Leeds series with Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's most famous work for organ, the Fantasia in F minor, and includes a rarity by Johann Müthel, a contemporary of CPE Bach, in the early classical style. After Jean Roger-Ducasse's beautiful and dramatic *Pastorale*, the concert finishes with Leo Sowerby's *Pageant*, one of the most famously challenging pieces for pedals in the repertoire, composed for the Italian virtuoso Fernando Germani.
